### THE CHRISTIANS OF THE MIDDLE EAST ARE EVAPORATING

During the month of October, 2,000 Christian Iraqi families were forced out of their homes in the city of Mousel (Nineveh) in Northern Iraq, to become refugees among the Kurds in Kurdistan, Iraq or in neighboring Syria, they were given 3 simple choices: oneconvert to Islam; two-leave their home only with the clothes on their backs; thirdbe killed. For the past four to five years prior to this past October, I was told they were paying (Al-Jizia) a tax for protection by the thugs and to keep their Christian faith. More that 100,000 Christian Iraqi have left the city of Mousel since the beginning of October of this year, many have been killed, execution style, none had left the faith and converted to Islam.

The number of Christians in Iraq has dwindled from 900,000 in 2003 to less than 100,000 left as of the writing of this letter. The same religious cleansing, which is tak-

ing place in Iraq over the past 5 years, has already taken place in the West Bank and Israel, with less than 100,000 Arab Christians left in Israel, less than 80,000 Arab Christians left in the West Bank and approximately 500 Arab Christians left in the Gaza Strip.

What is happening to the Christians of the Middle East is exactly what happened to the Christians in Turkey this past century. In Turkey, there were 2, 000,000 in 1920. Now there are only a few thousand left and it is my prediction that the same will happen to our Christian people in the Middle East.

There is no question in my mind that there are devious powers behind the disappearance of the Arabic speaking Middle East Christians. These people were called by his name (Christians) first in Syria, in the city of Antioch are the apple of his eye, and once these people are gone, I

think darkness will engulf the whole area as these people are the Light of the World, and I am certain that their shepherd will be very angry and will pour His and on the entire area and possibly the entire world, who stays silent watching these people disappear from their own homeland, or becoming refugees in their own homeland or the surrounding countries.

This Christmas, I am asking each and everyone of you to pray for the safety and the protection of our people in the Middle East, especially in Iraq, the West Bank, the Gaza Strip and Israel and despite our economical hardship in this country, we need not to forget these people and show them love and compassion, not only in words, but also by deeds.

Wishing every and each one of you a very Merry Christmas and a Happy and Prosperous New Year.
